Donations to Humanitarian Aid Activities in Ukraine and Neighboring Countries through "Sunflowers" of Van Gogh etc. by Sompo Group

Sompo Holdings, Inc. (Group CEO & President: Kengo Sakurada, hereinafter "Sompo Holdings") has decided to make donations to humanitarian aid activities in Ukraine and neighboring countries through Vincent van Gogh's "Sunflowers", which is currently on permanent exhibition at the Sompo Museum of Art (operated by the Sompo Fine Art Foundation) and owned by Sompo Japan Insurance Inc., in connection with Sunflowers, which have become a symbol of peace.

The Sompo Group holds "Creating a society in which every person can live a healthy, prosperous and happy life in one's own way" as SOMPO's Purpose, and is praying for the peace to come back to the international society including Ukraine even a day sooner. The Sompo Group also hopes that the artwork of Sunflowers, which has been regarded as a symbol of peace worldwide, will serve as an opportunity for many people to think about peace again, and that the circle of support will expand.
